

Saturday, March 24: March for our Lives Santa Barbara - Please join Reverend Tamara and members of our Social Justice Ministry as we stand up for our UU values and with our local students in this national student-led movement for gun reform. Bring your Live Oak rally signs; add your message on the blank side!

Students, their families, and supporters will rally and march on March 24, 2018 at De La Guerra Plaza in Santa Barbara, CA at 10 am. We stand in solidarity with the survivors of the Stoneman Douglas High School massacre, in honor of the kids who died there, and in support of all students who fear for their lives. The regularity of school shootings and gun violence against children is a uniquely American tragedy. Congress refuses to enact sensible, tried-and-tested laws to protect our children. 1,300 children each year die from gun related deaths, with a disproportionate number of the victims being children of color.

SHOW UP: 10:00 a.m. We'll have voter registration tables, sign-making supplies, and information from various local groups. Pickup of pre-ordered official March t-shirts begins at 10 am. (Too late to order shirts at this point.)

RALLY: 11:00 a.m. Speakers will be brief and will include people personally affected by our epidemic of gun violence.

MARCH: 12:00 noon. We march peacefully along State Street to 210 Victoria St. Additional route details to come soon.


